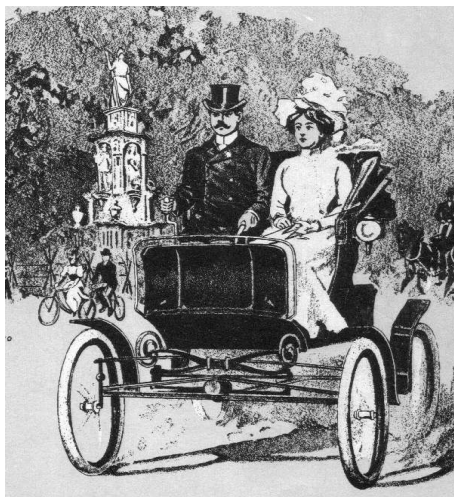


# The 26th Annual Highland Creek HERITAGE FESTIVAL

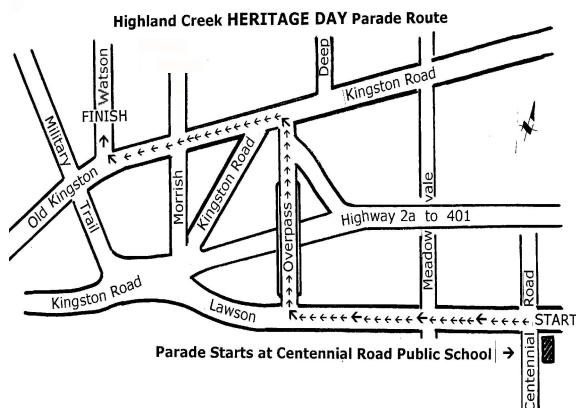


**Parade starts at 11:00 a.m.**
